

**BEST FIRST HALF OF 2023 FOR TORINO AIRPORT
NEVER SEEN SO MANY PASSENGERS IN THE JANUARY-JUNE PERIOD**

*Following the strong increase in snow traffic in the first four months of the year
and the growing number of tourists in the area thanks to spring long weekends,
the month of June also closed with a new record*

Caselle Torinese, 18 July 2023 – A record-breaking first semester closes for Torino Airport, which recorded its **best half-year ever** with more than 2.26 million passengers from January to June 2023.

In the first six months of the year, traffic reached **2,268,490 passengers, +18.7% more than in the first six months of 2022** (1,910,712 passengers) and **+12.5%** more than in the same period of 2019, the last pre-Covid year (2,016,709 passengers). The airport has thus beaten all previous records.

June 2023 is confirmed as the best month in the history of Torino Airport, with **408,880 passengers**: this figure exceeds by **+1.4%** the volumes registered in June 2022 (403,401 passengers), with an increase of **+23%** compared to June 2019 (332,445 passengers).

This result came after the excellent trend in snow traffic recorded in the first four months of 2023 by skiers from Northern Europe and the growing of incoming tourism to Piedmont, thanks to the spring long weekends.

Catania, Naples and Rome Fiumicino are confirmed as the busiest destinations in the first six months of 2023; in terms of international market, the top destinations are **London Gatwick, Barcelona and Madrid**.

The new flights launched with the start of the 2023 summer season have also contributed to this increase. Seven (7) new flights have been added to Torino Airport network: **Alicante** (from 1 May), **Stockholm** and **Vilnius**, served by Ryanair; **Paris Orly** (from 26 May), served by Volotea; **Foggia**, served by Lumiwings, to which have been added the flight to **Porto** (from 2 June) and the new incoming charter from Stockholm (from 10 June). These new flights are accompanied by the resumption of international flights to Zadar in Croatia, Corfu in Greece, Ibiza in Spain and Tel Aviv in Israel, in addition to the typical summer connections to Italian holiday destinations such as Lampedusa and Alghero.
